What's Ahead for the Sermons in February

The Pastor's Musings on Preaching God's Grace

Sunday, **February 7**

The Sermon: **"Finding Hope Amid the Hopeless"**

Readings of the day from Isaiah 6:1-8; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11; Luke 5:1-11

"That won't work." How many times did you say that to someone, or at least, thought that? "I've tried it," or, "you don't know things like I know them," or, "come on, you must be crazy!" When we are faced with very high obstacles in our lives, we might slide into a thinking that comes to the conclusion, "nothing is going to work." Jesus had his hands full with His fishermen-disciples who had empty nets. They wouldn't believe Him when he said, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." (Luke 5:4). Shall we try God's way when our ways fail? It's worth a try.

Sunday, **February 14**

The Sermon: **"God's 'Some Kind of Wonderful'"**

Readings of the day from Exodus 34:29-35; 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2; Luke 9:28-36
Let's see what your knowledge of music lyrics are from 1975. What is the title of the song with these lyrics? "I don't need a whole lot of money, I don't need a big fine car, I got everything that a man could want, I got more than I could ask for." Not hard to find the answer, and if you come to church this day, I'll be glad to announce it. The theme of the day is Transfiguration----to be changed from one form to another. Moses went to the mountain top and he received the 10 Commandments, and in so doing, he became "radiant." (Exodus 34:30). Jesus went to another mountain top and he, too, "became as bright as a flash of lightning." (Luke 9:29). Life-changing experiences will forever make us 'glow' with the radiance of God's love.

Ash Wednesday – February 17

Readings of the day from Joel 2:1-2, 12-17; 2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

The Sermon: **"It Is Close at Hand"**

Joel the prophet called out to the people of God to know the error of their ways. They had fallen out of practicing their covenant with God, and soon their willful sinning would catch up with them. Joel did not speak to become popular; he spoke to be faithful. Let us gather this evening to reflect, to ask for forgiveness, and find accord again with God's intention for our lives through our right actions.

Sunday, **February 21** - First Sunday in Lent

The Sermon: **"When We Wander Our Own Wildernesses"**

Readings of the day from Deuteronomy 26:1-11; Romans 10:8b-13; Luke 4:1-13
Surely the Hebrew people knew the hardship of being slaves to a fierce Pharaoh. Also Jesus knew what it was to be tested as the Son of God by the Tempter. We are not exempt from demands and temptations in our own lives. What to do? How to be faithful?

Sunday, **February 28** – The Second Sunday in Lent

The Sermon: **"A Lament Is Not the Last Word"**

Readings of the day from Genesis 15:1-12; Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 13:31-35
Abram (who would become Abraham) was at his wit's end. He thought we would never have children, but that was not the last word from God. Jesus looked over Jerusalem and sighed, "You who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how often I have longed to gather your children together...but you were not willing!" (Luke 13:34). Both lamented, but both would have their hopes fulfilled by our all powerful and faithful God!

Some Potential Opportunities through the UCC in Ohio are:

CLEVELAND:

Work Needed: The Urban Immersion - Cleveland Style Project is sponsored by a cluster of urban churches, and their supporting suburban ring partners. Your time here will be planned out (with your input) to highlight issues of hunger, poverty, health care, community, etc. Specific work for the core summer program might include helping out with food pantries or community meal serving, home or yard work for elderly or disabled neighbors, or tasks like cleaning up a small park, painting a room, or building an accessibility ramp.

TOLEDO:

Work Needed: Focus of mission trip experience is to help your group experience the neighborhood and church of Nu-vizion, while assisting in certain projects that are part of the on-going ministries of this inner-city new church start. Project possibilities include: building and facilities maintenance such as painting, cleaning, construction, lawn care; outreach such as assorted feeding ministries, working in CHEEP store clothing bank, staffing community events, trash pick up, repair on local houses, staffing church outreach events such as concerts or picnics; or children's ministries such as working with summer programming of Bible study, arts and crafts; VBS. Staff matches work projects with the specific interests and skills of the group.

CINCINNATI:

Work Needed: Mission trips are experiences of worship and service. Experiences include simple construction, maintenance, street feasts, and work with neighborhood children and elders.

HIRAM:

Work Needed: Provides opportunities for people with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) to grow, learn, work and live in a setting focused on respect and support for individuals and the environment. Volunteers help with gardening, afternoon livestock chores, light and skilled construction projects (based on skill and need) and assist with craft and art projects with Autistic participants on a limited basis.

This year's special Lenten Appeal is going to be designated to **One Great Hour of Sharing**.

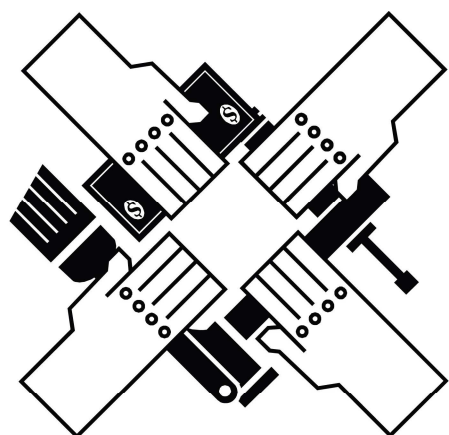

HYGIENE KITS

In the face of natural disasters, violence, or grinding poverty, Hygiene Kits can mean the difference between sickness and health for struggling families.

To assemble a Hygiene Kit you will need:

- * One hand towel measuring approximately 16" x 28" (no fingertip or bath towels)
- * One washcloth
- * One wide-tooth comb
- * One nail clipper
- * One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- * One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- * Six Band-Aids®

Please do not add toothpaste to the Hygiene Kit. Toothpaste that has an extended expiration date will be added to Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment. Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure.

Hygiene Kit value: \$10

Processing/Shipping Cost: \$2 per Kit

BABY KITS

In areas of extreme poverty or following a natural disaster, Baby Kits help young mothers care for their newborn babies.

To assemble a Baby Kit you will need:

- * Six cloth diapers
- * Two T-shirts or undershirts (no onesies)
- * Two washcloths
- * Two gowns or sleepers
- * Two diaper pins
- * One sweater or sweatshirt
- * Two receiving blankets (one can be a hand-knitted or crocheted baby blanket)

All items should be new. Wrap items inside one of the receiving blankets and secure with both diaper pins.

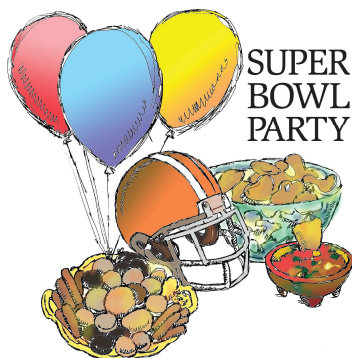

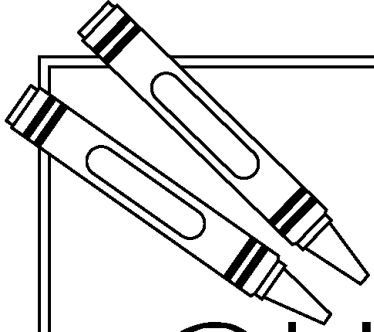
Notes from the January 2010 Consistory Meeting

Please remember that you are always welcome to attend one of the monthly Consistory meetings. They are usually held on the third Wednesday of each month.

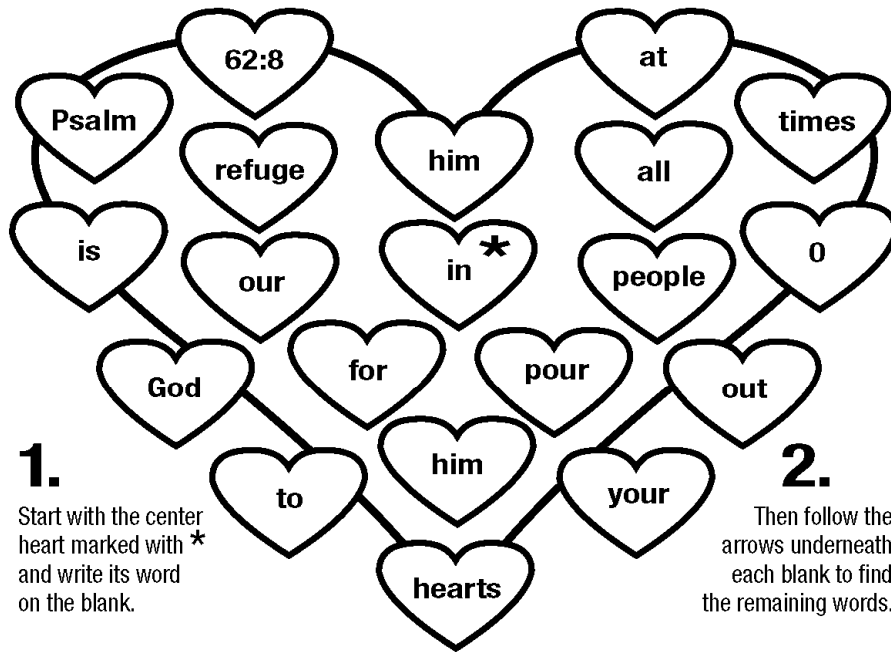
